

- Medicaid is health insurance for low-income children, pregnant women, the elderly, and the disabled. It supports thousands of jobs and billions of dollars in the health care sector, one of the largest industries in Alabama.
- Alabama has one of the most restrictive Medicaid eligibilities in the country.
- There are ZERO non-disabled, childless adults (18-64) enrolled in Alabama Medicaid.
- Adults in a family of three earning more than \$320 a month cannot qualify.
- Alabama Medicaid is a **bare-bones program** that only covers the minimum services required by the federal government.
- Alabama's Medicaid program has one of the lowest administrative costs in the country—less than 3%.
- Alabama has the **3rd lowest cost per enrollee** in the country.
- Alabama spends less on the disabled population than any other state in the nation.
- 60 to 70 percent of patients at the state's two children's hospitals are covered by Medicaid.
